<u>CONSTRUCTION AT THE PARSIPPANY-TROY HILLS</u> <u>TRANSFER STATION</u>

The Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority (MCMUA) is scheduling construction at its Parsippany-Troy Hills transfer station over the next several months to renovate the main tipping floor. During this time, other concrete and steel re-construction will also take place. The construction phases will renovate, two (2) bay doors of the tipping floor at a time. Once started, the total project time is anticipated to be 145 calendar days with completion scheduled for February, 2020. Please note that during this time, the MCMUA Parsippany-Troy Hills transfer



station <u>WILL BE OPEN</u> to all customers. Some delays during construction should be expected so haulers are reminded that our Mount Olive facility is available for use. In addition, during the construction period, <u>tire recycling collection at the Parsippany transfer station will be suspended</u>. Please go to our website to find alternate facilities that manage tires. The MCMUA thanks you in advance for your patience and cooperation while we work to improve the facility.

HAPPENINGS AT THE MCMUA

Checks – We are now accepting checks to be deposited into your MCMUA account at both the Parsippany-Troy Hills and Mount Olive transfer stations, Monday through Saturday, during normal operating hours.

Balances/Daily or Monthly Tipping Reports By Email - We can now offer computer generated balances and/or daily or monthly tipping reports sent by email.

Statements By Email – We can now email statement(s) usually available the 2nd week of the following month.

HELP US PREVENT LEACHATE SPILLS

Please be aware, the MCMUA has had an unacceptable influx of leachate (liquid) spilled at our transfer stations recently. This is due to either failed seals on containers and trucks or containers not closing fully before exiting the tipping floor. MCMUA Rules and Regulations #14 states "The back of packer trucks and roll-off containers must be opened and closed on the tipping floor." Not following this rule can result in violations of the New Jersey Water Pollution Control Act (N.J.S.A. 58:10A-1), our NJDES Stormwater Permits (N.J.A.C. 7:14A-2.89a)), our Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans (SPPP), and our Operations and Maintenance (O&M) Manuals. MCMUA requires all containers and trucks to be in working order including ensuring that seals are properly working before coming to the transfer stations. We request you please inspect your seals and repair any container or truck which leaks. The cleanup of spilled leachate can be extensive and takes away from our employees' normal tasks, which may result in delays for all of our customers as a result of the spill. We thank you for your time and cooperation on this matter.

RECYCLING

Recycling is Mandatory for Specific Materials



Morris County has designated specific materials to be source separated and recycled. This mandate applies to all Morris County waste generators including residents, businesses, schools, institutions, construction sites, etc. A listing of these mandated recyclable materials is provided in the sidebar on the right, but please note that this listing is a generalized listing. Specific

definitions of these materials and any exceptions that may apply are available on the MCMUA website at http://mcmua.com/.

Please realize that Morris County's source separation recycling mandate is nothing new, as these materials have been mandated to be recycled since 1993. Disposing of designated recyclable materials in the trash is not acceptable and is illegal in Morris County. The MCMUA has been advised that the Morris County Office of Health Management will be inspecting loads and issuing fines for disposing of designated recyclables at the transfer stations.
