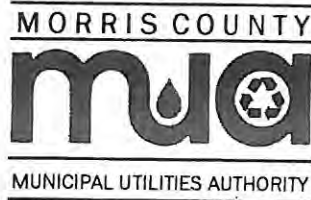
The Department of Environmental Protection's (Department) Solid and Hazardous Waste Management Program is in receipt of a May 10, 2007 request for administrative action to the Morris County District Solid Waste Management Plan (County Plan). The subject request for administrative action proposes to modify the County Plan to include the Veolia ES Technical Solutions, LLC Transfer Station, located on Block 4500, Lot 37 at 1 Eden Lane in the Township of Mount Olive to also operate as a commercial collection facility for regulated medical waste. The May 10, 2007 request for administrative action to the County Plan does not change the subject facility's overall capacity, which is included in the facility's Solid Waste Facility Permit as 1,520 tons per year.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-6.11(b)12, the inclusion of a commercial collection facility for regulated medical waste can be accomplished via an administrative action. Therefore, the County Plan inclusion of the Veolia ES Technical Solutions, LLC Transfer Station as a commercial collection facility for regulated medical waste is hereby approved as an administrative action pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-6.11(f).

This approval shall not be construed as an expression of the Department's intent to issue a Solid Waste Facility Permit or Permit Modification for any proposed facility or operation. **RE: Administrative Action Request – Veolia Environmental Services, Flanders, NJ
Adding Acceptance of Regulated Medical Waste to the Existing Facility**

Dear Bob:

In a letter dated February 27, 2007, Veolia Environmental Services Technical Solutions, L.L.C. ("Veolia"), located at 1 Eden Lane in the Flanders portion of Mount Olive Township (Block 4500; Lot 37), requested the Morris County Solid Waste Management Plan ("Plan") inclusion of that facility be modified to allow Veolia to operate additionally as a commercial collection facility for regulated medical waste. A copy of this letter has been attached for your reference. For your information, prior to its corporate name change to Veolia, this facility was known as Onyx Environmental Services and prior to that it was known as AETS.

Veolia currently operates a New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection ("NJDEP") Part B permitted facility for the storage and collection of hazardous waste as its primary operation at that site. This hazardous waste operation is outside the jurisdiction of the county's Plan. In addition, in a Plan amendment dated June 1999, as certified as approved by NJDEP on November 9, 1999, this site was included in the Plan to allow for the acceptance of ID-27 non-hazardous industrial waste.

In accordance with Veolia's letter dated February 27, 2007, it now wants to amend its Plan inclusion to allow for the acceptance of regulated medical waste. State regulations, specifically N.J.A.C. 7:26-6.11 (b)-12, allow for modifications to the Plan with respect to the operation of commercial collection facilities for medical waste that may be achieved through an administrative action procedure. This administrative action procedure permits the county's designated implementing agency, which is the Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority ("MCMUA"), to submit a letter to the NJDEP describing and requesting the change to the Plan in lieu of going through the more formal and time-consuming Plan amendment process.

Although not specifically required in accordance with N.J.A.C. 7:26-6.11 (b)-12, the MCMUA requested the host municipality of Mt. Olive to forward its opinion on this change prior to the MCMUA requesting this administrative action. In a resolution adopted by its Council on May 8, 2007, Mt. Olive Township stated, "it does authorize, consent and endorse the modification to the




County's Solid waste Management Plan to include the facility of Veolia Environmental Services at Eden Lane, Block 4500, Lot 37 for the disposal of regulated medical waste." Copies of correspondence related to this host municipal opinion have been attached.

In summary, this letter is provided as an administrative action requesting that the acceptance of regulated medical waste at the Veolia facility, as per the attached February 27, 2007 letter, be determined to be consistent with the Morris County Solid Waste Management Plan.

This is a request that the county solid waste management plan be modified to identify the facility listed below as a commercial collection facility for medical waste:



Veolia currently operates a NJDEP Part B permitted facility for the storage and transfer of hazardous and solid waste at this location. The facility is currently approved to accept Class D Recyclable and Type 27 Dry Industrial Waste, and would like the additional ability to accept Regulated Medical Waste.

The Regulated Medical Waste would be packaged and labeled according to NJDEP and DOT regulations at the generator location. The packages would be transported back to the Veolia facility in service trucks and staged in storage trailers prior to shipment to a permitted treatment/disposal facility. Storage and transfer at the Veolia facility would allow for a more expeditious and economical management of these waste streams.

The Plan amendment process involves county Solid Waste Advisory Council review followed by a public hearing on the matter by the Board of Chosen Freeholders. This is then followed by a lengthy approval and certification process by NJDEP.

Prior to issuing an administrative action to NJDEP, the MCMUA is seeking the position of the host municipality of the Township of Mt. Olive on this matter. It is requested that this letter be distributed to Mt. Olive's municipal elected officials and that the governing body of Mt. Olive Township adopt a resolution within three (3) months of the receipt of this letter setting forth its position relative to the proposed modification to the Plan. Please be aware that if there is no resolution adopted with reference

to this matter by Mt. Olive Township's governing body within three (3) months of the receipt of this letter, the MCMUA may consider submitting an administrative action to the NJDEP without consideration of the township's position.


**RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE
