Dear Mr. Gindoff:

The Department of Environmental Protection's (Department) Solid and Hazardous Waste Management Program is in receipt of a December 22, 2011 request for administrative action to the Morris County District Solid Waste Management Plan (County Plan). The December 22, 2011 request for administrative action to the County Plan proposes County Plan inclusion of changes in language which will make the County Plan inclusion of the two Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority (MCMUA) Class B/C Recycling Centers located in the Townships of Parsippany-Troy Hills (Block 7, Lot 2 at 500 West Hanover Avenue) and Mount Olive (Block 400, Lot 1 and Block 401, Lot 4 at Waterloo Road) consistent with each facility's General Approval to Operate issued by the Department.

Specifically, the subject request for administrative action to the County Plan seeks to:

1. With respect to the Parsippany site, modify the Class C operation's capacity limit to be 48,800 cubic yards (CY) of unprocessed material to be on site at one time as opposed to 63,000 CY accepted annually. The current GA allows the MCMUA to have approximately 48,800 cubic yards of Class C recyclables on site at one time.
2. With respect to the Parsippany site, modify the Class B operation's capacity limit to 6,700 CY of unprocessed material to be on site at one time as opposed to 3,500 CY accepted annually. Additionally, modify the inclusion of the Class B brush-grinding operation to eliminate the 4" limitation on the diameter of the brush that is allowed to be processed. This is being eliminated since it was based on a regulation that is no longer applicable. The revised size limitation requested is to be based on the ability of the site's equipment to process such material.

3. With respect to the Mount Olive site, modify the Class C operation's capacity limit to be 47,900 CY of unprocessed material to be on site at one time as opposed to 94,000 CY accepted annually. The current GA allows the MCMUA to have approximately 47,900 cubic yards of Class C recyclables on site at one time.
4. With respect to the Mount Olive site, modify the Class B operation's capacity limit to be 29,500 CY of Class B recyclables on site at one time. The current GA allows the MCMUA to have 29,400 CY of Class B recyclables on site at one time and limits the receipt of Class B recyclables at the site to 152 tons per day. It is the MCMUA's understanding that the Department will be adjusting the GA's limitation on brush from 29,400 CY to 29,500 CY in the next renewal process due to an error in its calculations.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-6.11(b)5, modifications to the County Plan inclusion of operations at existing recycling centers can be accomplished via an administrative action. Therefore, the December 22, 2011 request for administrative action to the County Plan is hereby approved pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-6.11(f).
