Subject: 2022 Clean Communities Grant for Schools in Morris County **Keep Morris County Litter Free!**

I am delighted to offer your school an opportunity to participate in a program being sponsored by the Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority (MCMUA) through the Morris County Clean Communities program to schools in Morris County, grades 5 through 12, titled, Keep Morris County Litter Free! As you may know, the New Jersey Clean Communities (NJCC) program is a statewide litter abatement program that focuses on the cleanup of litter, enforcement, and changing the attitudes of those who litter through education.

To promote this initiative, the MCMUA has developed a grant program for schools. The grant for schools requires that a minimum of 20 students in addition to their adult supervisors participate in a litter cleanup of at least 2 acres of the outdoor school grounds (school property, ball fields, and wooded areas on the school property) between April 18 and June 18, 2022. Due to the pandemic, teachers and/or parents may participate in place of students, (with at least one teacher, leading the cleanup and will be responsible for paperwork/photos). All must follow CDC guidelines, wear proper PPE and practice social distancing during the cleanup project. Once the project is complete and the designated paperwork has been submitted, the school will receive a **\$600.00 grant** to be used to purchase outdoor receptacles for trash and recyclables or for indoor receptacles for recyclables (indoor receptacles for trash are excluded); or to assist paying for a water filler station (purchased during 2022). Bottle filler stations reduce the use of single-use plastic water bottles.

We suggest that you pass this letter along with the enclosed application packet to the advisor of your environmental club, green team, or other school organization that would be interested in this project. Applications will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis, as our funds are limited and you will be notified of receipt. A second project, the poster contest, is described in the second letter.

Submit completed application forms A through E (completed by faculty member in charge of cleanup) and certification form (that must be signed by your school Business Administrator) by April 10, 2022. All must follow CDC guidelines, wear proper PPE and practice social distancing during the cleanup project.

The week of the cleanup:

- Take a picture of the students with bags of collected litter in front of the school, or on school property (mail photo with summary form after cleanup).
- If participating in the poster contest (see second letter), display all posters for one week at the school.
- The participating faculty member and three adults must be sure that all recyclables from the cleanup are collected separately from trash in order to be recycled, and that all trash be properly disposed. Remember to take a picture of the bags of trash and count everything in order to properly complete the summary form.
- Please note: At the time of your cleanup, there must be <u>no snow</u> on the ground.

After the cleanup:

- The <u>completed summary form</u> (a list of bags of trash and recyclables as well as other details of the cleanup) must be received by the MCMUA by June 24, 2022.
- Three pictures must be provided from the litter cleanup with the summary form. **One of the three** pictures/photos <u>must show the bags of collected litter</u> and the participants.
- The school must submit one paragraph about the cleanup to a local newspaper along with one picture (this is a great project for a student). Or post narrative on school website.
- The MCMUA plans to issue a check (payment) to the school for \$600.00, following submission of completed summary report and photos. Grant funds are to be used specifically for outdoor recycling or trash receptacles or indoor recycling receptacles, or water filler station. Please visit <u>www.MCMUA.com</u> for a list of vendors who sell recycling and trash receptacles.
- The school will purchase the recycling/trash receptacles or filler station by December 1, 2022.
- A copy of the invoice for the purchase(use of grant money) by the school will be provided to the MCMUA by December 15, 2022.

The undersigned, being a duly authorized representative of_______, (hereafter applicant), hereby affirms that APPLICANT is a bona fide non-profit group and has no affiliation, either directly or indirectly, with any political party. Further, if awarded a Clean Communities Mini-Grant, APPLICANT agrees to:

- 1. Utilize no less than 20 students, exclusive of adult supervisors (1 faculty member and three other adults), to actively participate in a program of litter pickup and removal at your school.
- 2. Provide adult supervision for this project (one faculty member plus three more adults for a group of 20 students) or a ratio of no less than one adult supervisor for each 5 participants under the age of 18 is assured.

3. Schedule the PROJECT for <u>no less than a two hour duration</u>.

- 4. Provide the Morris County MUA with completed forms.
- 5. Provide the Morris County MUA with completed Summary Form no later than June 24, 2022. Use conversion chart to help with estimating weights.
- 6. Assume responsibility for any costs associated with the collection, recycling and disposal of all collected litter. **RECYCLING IS MANDATORY IN MORRIS COUNTY**.
- 7. Indemnify and hold harmless the MCMUA and County of Morris and its employees from and against any, and all liability, loss, accident or injury to persons or property resulting either directly or indirectly from participation in the litter cleanup.

FORM E **RECYCLABLE LITTER**

I understand that recycling is the law in the State of New Jersey. To participate in the Clean Communities Program in Morris County we are required to keep all mandated recyclables separate from the trash that is collected. The following mandated recyclables must be recycled:

- Aluminum cans
- Steel cans
- Glass bottles and jars
- Plastic bottles (with a neck) coded #1 and #2.
- Dry corrugated cardboard
- Clean newspaper and mixed paper (magazines, junk mail, etc.)
- Tires must be recycled!
- Any scrap wood or metal, that you are able to recycle (not mandated to be recycled)

Please refer to the attached list of mandated recyclables.

My group will be sure to keep all recyclables separate from trash during the cleanup and take the recyclables to the municipal recycling depot/center or put them into the recycling dumpsters/containers at our school (if available).

GUIDELINES FOR A SUCCESSFUL PROJECT

- 1. Before starting your cleanup, instruct all participants that they should not pick up anything they believe to be hazardous (i.e. medical waste, unknown liquid/chemical substances, animal carcasses, etc.) If you encounter such items you should notify the Public Works Department or Police Department in the town where you are doing the cleanup.
- 2. Schedule your cleanup to take place during day light hours.
- 3. Suggestions for cleanup team:
 - wear long pants; blue jeans recommended, and a long sleeve shirt/jacket.
 - wear work boots or heavy shoes. Minimum ankle high suggested.
 - wear work gloves supplied by Morris County Clean Communities.
 - dress warmly during cold weather.
 - use the bathroom before reporting to the cleanup area. •
- 4. Refreshments: provide plenty of cold drinks in summer; hot drinks in winter.
- 5. Designate someone to serve as photographer for the cleanup (you will need to submit 3 photos from your cleanup to meet the requirements). One of the three photos must picture the bags of litter you collected during the litter cleanup. Contact the local newspaper for media coverage.
- 6. Be sure all recyclables are kept separate from trash in order to be recycled. Properly dispose of all collected trash. Be sure to count the bags of litter collected in order to complete the summary form.
- 7. Learn to identify **poison ivy.** Avoid any contact with noxious weeds or thorny plants. The recommended attire will usually prevent irritations from most plants.
- 8. Be alert for bees, wasps, hornets, snakes and ticks. Tuck pants into socks.
- 9. Pay special attention to the handling of broken glass and sharp pieces of metal. This should be done by the adult advisor. Do not step or kneel on broken glass or metal.
- 10. Avoid unsafe behavior: All unsafe behavior such as standing or jumping on guardrails, drainage pipes, bridges or concrete walls, horseplay and demonstrations must be avoided.

Be sure to review all guidelines with participants prior to the cleanup.

You can list the number of bags of trash and number of bags of recyclables. You can weigh all trash and recyclables you've collected during you cleanup to get accurate weights if you like. In addition, please find the conversion chart below.

Conversion Chart

To be used for the Summary Report

Conversion of volume to weight for recyclable materials

<u>Newspaper</u> One 12" stack = 35 lbs.

<u>Batteries</u> One auto battery = 33 lbs.

Corrugated Cardboard 1 cubic yard = 285 lbs.

<u>Used motor oil</u> One gallon = 7lbs.

<u>Garbage</u> One 33 gallon bag = 20 lbs.

<u>Mixed paper</u> 1 cubic yard = 500 lbs.

<u>Vehicle tires</u> 1 car tire = 20 lbs. 1 truck tire = 60lbs.

<u>Commingled recyclables</u> (includes aluminum, steel, glass and plastic) One 33 gallon plastic bag = 25 lbs.

The cardboard and mixed paper will be hard to gauge. If you have the means to weigh it, you would have more of an accurate number.
